Justification

Prefix: As asked to consider, the course should be cross-listed with the Chicana/o Studies Program.

Title V US History: The title and course description for this course are modified to make these areas consistent with the title of the proposed BA degree in Chicana/o Studies. Also, In accordance to Executive Order no.: 405 of the Office of the Chancellor of the California State University HIST 350 Chicano History and Cultures examines significant events covering well over the “minimum time span of approximately one hundred years occurring in the entire area now included in the United States of America.” The course also studies the relationship of regions, both internal and external, including powers as appropriate to appreciate historical events of the United States as mandated by Section I A. 1. of this executive order. The course also examines the role of major ethnic groups (European, African American, Mexican, and Asian) in relation to events and the historical context in which they took place as required in Section I A. 2 of the this executive order. Although not explicitly detailed in the old course proposal, this course now states in its modified course description an attention to the relationship of Mexicanos to the economic, political, and social institutions of the United States. These institutions are examined in relation historical movement and developments that span over several centuries. This modification fulfills Section I A. 3 of the executive order requiring the illustration of the continuity of the “American experience and its derivation from other cultures including consideration of three or more of the following: politics, economics, social movements, and geography.”
