- Replace ART 492 Internship in the Arts with ART 490 Special Topics in Art as a requirement in the ART Major.

## JUSTIFICATION

During the past two academic years, it has become an obvious necessity to implement a portfolio review requirement for all ART Majors seeking internships. Art Majors who pass the portfolio review will be eligible to apply to for Arts Internship placement. This requirement will insure that a standard level of artistic skills, academic preparation and artistic achievement will be upheld prior to placing students in professional working conditions related to their area of study within the arts. It will further assure potential internship (community) providers that interns placed within their working environments possess the necessary (minimum) skill levels needed to perform in the position they are assigned to. In addition, due to the largely increased amount of declared Art Majors, it has become impractical and nearly impossible to locate, organize and administer the amount of internships needed to place ALL Art Majors into an internship prior to graduation. This has created a problem that could adversely affect Art students' progress toward graduation in a timely manner.

With the addition of ART 490 Special Topics in Art replacing ART 492 Internship in the Arts as a requirement within the ART Major, the amount of units required for graduation will NOT change. The implementation of this course as a requirement will further serve to enhance the current ART Major curricula within the "Professional Practices" category of the ART Major and create flexibility whereas pertinent and rotating topics directly related to needs of the students, program and evolving circumstances in the field of art may be presented to the students.

The addition of the new courses listed above will broaden a student's choices in the Art Program, which will subsequently lead to increased expertise within selected media and enhanced prospects for future professional opportunities or graduate study.

No new resources will be required to implement these changes to the ART Program.
