SUMMARY OF CHANGES

The title and description of the minor have been modified to make them consistent with the BA in Chicana/o Studies: Transborder Communities Degree Long Form proposal. To serve as a foundation in this area of study, at the lower division level additional courses have been added for students to select. Related to this, the required unit range in Spanish has been reduced to 3 to 4. Similarly, at the upper-division level additional courses have been included that did not exist when the original minor was designed.

Both SPAN 202 and SPAN 212—which either one can be taken—have a prerequisite. CHS 331 also has a prerequisite. These courses have the potential of raising the units for the minor by 7. Therefore the unit range for the minor is 18-25.

JUSTIFICATION

The modification makes the minor consistent with the content and principles within the BA in Chicana/o Studies: Transborder Communities Degree Long Form proposal. The added curriculum also affords students a broader range of courses to select from to earn this minor.
