Justification: 1. Title: Does not currently reflect the fact that this course culminates with an examination. New title clearly states that this seminar results in examination. Preparation for the examination is described in the course description.
2. MA students in the Specialization, Education Specialist, must take three units of EDUC 618 to meet the 30 unit program requirement.
3. Corequisites: Currently, the description does not indicate that advancement to candidacy is required. This is a culminating experience course that cannot be taken before the final semester.
4. Catalog Description: It is added that this course culminates in the final exam. Currently, the catalog only indicates preparation for the examination.
5. Enrollment: This is an intense preparation course where the professor assigned to the course is responsible for preparing and grading the exams. Previously, one faculty member prepared the students while other faculty graded the exams. The reduced enrollment number reflects the added workload for the course instructor.
6. Objectives: Added is one objective, to complete the culminating assessment requirement for the degree, the examination.
