#### SUMMARY OF CHANGES

- 1. Students in the English Education emphasis will not be required to choose English 325; rather, they can choose any 2 of the major authors courses just as other English majors do. However, they are required to take ENGL 210, Themes in World Literature, as one of their electives or GE choices prior to receiving waiver credit for the California Standards Test in English.
- 2. Students choosing Sequence C will take English 475 and then choose from either a focus on Adolescent literature (ENGL 477) or on writing as reflective practice (ENGL 478).

#### JUSTIFICATION

1. The previous modification (requiring English 325) was made to satisfy the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) requirements for non-Western literature. The CCTC rejected this modification as not offering enough breadth. In consultation with our consultant for the CCTC, we have developed the lower division survey course instead. It is now pending final approval.

Students not seeking a CSET waiver may still receive an English Education Emphasis on their transcript without English 210, as it is not required for the emphasis itself.

2. We added a new English Education course to the catalog last year (ENGL 478, Writing as Reflective Practice). This new course enables us to offer Sequence C students a choice of English Education courses to take. This more closely parallels the other sequences which all offer choices. Additionally, since 477 is currently offered only in the fall and 478 only in the spring, the change will enable more students to complete Sequence C in a timely fashion.
