Description Provides the returning RN and /or the transfer student with the conceptual base for the practice of nursing, built around a core of theories and related concepts which will facilitate transition of the student into the baccalaureate nursing curriculum. Familiarizes the student with the components and use of the nursing process and presents the delivery of nursing care based on the Neuman Systems Model. Focus is on the roles of the professional nurse as advocate, educator, provider and coordinator of care.

5. Analyze the role of the nurse as an advocate, a professional, a coordinator of care, a provider of care and teacher.
6. Discuss the relationship between the nursing process, critical thinking, the problem-solving process, and the decision-making process.
7. Identify the basics of philosophical and or theoretical support for professional nursing practice.
