Criteria Justifications

- Promote understanding of how the issues relevant to social, political, contemporary/historical, economic, educational or psychological realities interact with each other within the realm of human experience
 - .This course uses the medium of film to explore political realities. Political science topics such as campaigns and elections, political and social equality and justice and the competition between hope and cynicism are examined using examples and ideas drawn from commercially released films.
- Focus on how a social science discipline conceives and studies human existence
 - .Pols/Comm 335 studies important topics in political experience (for example, leadership during the cold war, political behavior during the Great Depression). As in interdisciplinary course, human existence is studied through both the lens of political science as well as communication studies.
- Address issues using the methods commonly employed by a social science discipline
 - . One of the methods of analysis used by political scientists is the case study method. This course is structured around case studies using film as the vehicle to capture each given case.

 Emphasize interdisciplinarity by integrating content, ideas, and approaches from two or more disciplines

More than any other art form, motion pictures reach a mass audience. Film is not only an art form, but it is a powerful method of communication. American films have dealt with political issues in a wide variety of settings and contexts, and millions have been exposed to the ideas, images, and emotions contained in these films. This course will explore film as method of political communication complete with symbols, imagery and other tools of modern mass communication. Film is also a powerful tool of political persuasion and socialization, and this course will explore the political message and influence of major American films.

• Include substantive written work consisting of in-class writing as well as outside class writing of revised prose. Examples of appropriate written work include: short papers, long papers, term papers, lab reports, documentation, disciplinary-based letters and memos, and essays.

Assessment of student performance in this course will include weekly written reviews of films viewed in addition to a comprehensive research paper on a major theme in contemporary American political films.
