Overview

The Committee on Committees is pleased to announce that **nominations for Senate Standing Committees, Senate Advisory Committees, and Ad Hoc/Special/Other Committees and Positions for AY 2020–21** will be open April 18–24, 2020.

Unless specified otherwise, **positions are open to all tenured, probationary, or lecturer faculty with no fewer than 6 WTUs at the time of the election.** A list of open positions and an explanation of disciplinary constituencies are provided at the end of this document. A link to the nomination form will be provided at 8 AM on April 18, 2020; watch your e-mail.

Please note **several important changes in the nominating and elections process**, designed to simplify the elections and to promote informed voting and elections transparency.

- Only self-nominations will be accepted. Third party nominations are no longer permitted.
- Nominees are requested to furnish a statement of interest and qualifications with their nomination. These will be shared verbatim with the electorate.
- Nominations are being collected via Qualtrics; the election will be conducted using a third-party system called Election Runner, designed specifically for secure online voting.
- Complete elections results will be made available, including vote tallies.

- The **nomination period** will open at 8 AM on Saturday, April 18, 2020 and will close at 11:59 PM on Friday, April 24, 2020
- The **Voter Guide** will be circulated at 8 AM on Sunday, April 26, 2020; nominees will have until 5 PM on Monday, April 27, 2020 to call any errors or omissions to the attention of Committee on Committees
- The **ballotting period** will open at 8 AM on Tuesday, April 28, 2020 and will close at 11:59 PM on Monday, May 4, 2020

Disciplinary Constituencies

General Positions

The disciplinary constituencies for Academic Senate Standing and Advisory Committees, and for any other position solicitation under the purview of the Academic Senate are as follows, unless indicated otherwise. Faculty who teach in multiple program areas should use their area of primary appointment in determining their disciplinary constituency:

- Arts & Humanities: Art, English, History, Performing Arts, Spanish
- Behavioral & Social Sciences: Chicano Studies, Communication, Global Studies, Library, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology
- Business & Economics: All faculty appointed in the Martin V. Smith School (Business, Economics)
- Education: All faculty appointed in the School of Education (ECS/Liberal Studies, Teaching Credentials, SOE Graduate Programs)
- Library & Counselors: All faculty librarians and faculty counselors. Should CI add faculty coaches, they would be included in this constituency.
- Math & Sciences: Anthropology, Applied Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science/IT, ESRM, Health Sciences, Math, Nursing
- Lecturer Representatives: Faculty from any discipline who hold the rank of Lecturer and have a contract for a minimum of 6 WTUS in the term of election are eligible for Lecturer Representative positions

Local Curriculum Committees/Academic Policy and Planning Committee ONLY

The disciplinary constituencies for the Local Curriculum Committees are determined by the Academic Policy and Planning Committee. During AY 2019–20, these constituencies are as follows:

- Arts & Humanities: Art, English, History, Performing Arts, Spanish
- Behavioral & Social Sciences: Chicano Studies, Communication, Global Studies, Library, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology
- Math & Sciences: Anthropology, Applied Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science/IT, ESRM, Math
- Professional Studies: Business, ECS/Liberal Studies, Economics, Health Sciences, Nursing, Teaching Credentials, SOE Graduate Programs
