Senate Materials for April 8th

In continuing business, we have one item, SP 13-10 a revision of SP 08-08 Policy on Withdrawal. This revision provides criteria for "Serious and Compelling" reasons as well as updating the policy to define deadlines for courses offered other than in the 16-week format.

As this is the penultimate senate meeting, we have six first reading items on our agenda in anticipation of a vote at our final meeting at the end of April. Faculty Affairs Committee submits two policies for consideration. The first is "Student Opinion of Teaching Survey" that would supercede SR 08-01 and SP07-19 and replace the current Student Ratings of Teaching (SRT). The second is "Policy on Mode of Instruction" aims to clarify the process for changing the mode of instruction of individual courses.

The three other policies we see are from Research and Sponsored Programs and are needed for compliance at various levels. These are new policies that are also going through the President's Policy and Planning Council, and have been seen there as first reading items. These policies are "testing" our new routing system for policies that have both faculty "academic" and university "administrative" implications. Changes made in either body will need to be reconciled with the other so we result in a single policy. The final item for first reading is the 2017-2018 Academic Calendar.
